 - Vote 25 for 0 Against 1 Abstain = Vote Passed
 - o The new Bylaws are now in effect
- 4H Donation Tabled from April Meeting
 - Just Horsing Around Club with 25 club members need help this year as the
 Washington County Fairgrounds are closed for 1-2 years and the club has to move
 their operations to Yamhill. This is causing a need to double their annual budget to
 \$20,000. Goal of the program is to teach kids safety, care, and teamwork through
